Act of presence of God

- 1. 'Gratias tibi, Deus, gratias tibi!' The life of each of us ought to be a hymn of thanksgiving. Just look how Opus Dei has come about. You, Lord, have done it all...(Notes from a meditation given by St Josemaría on 27th March, 1975). Do I thank God for the Work and for the initiatives that the people of Opus Dei promote together with their friends and acquaintances?
- 2. 'Lift up your eyes and see how the fields are already white for the harvest' (Jn 4:35). Do I see that perhaps God is counting on me to carry out this part of the Church which is the Work? What am I doing to stir up my enthusiasm at the sight of these horizons?
- 3. St Josemaría reminds us that 'your ordinary contact with God takes place where your fellow men, your yearnings, your work and your affections are. There, you have your daily encounter with Christ' (Conversations, 113). In which of these areas could I be more aware of Our Lord's presence and make him better known?
- 4. The Lord 'chose us...before the foundation of the world that we should be holy' (Eph 1:4), St Paul reminds us. Knowing that I was chosen by God with a special love, what great horizons do I set myself? How can I share them also with my spouse and children?
- 5. 'Holy Michael, the Archangel, defend us in the day of battle. Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil' (Prayer to St Michael). Could I trust more in the Archangel Michael's protection as a patron of the Work?
- 6. 'Pray a lot for the Pope. Love him a lot. (Notes from a get together with St Josemaría 11 May 1965). Do I pray for the whole Church and especially for the Pope and the Bishops, trusting that my prayer can be a real and effective help?
- 7. The Rosary is 'a powerful weapon to enable us to win in our interior struggle and to help all souls (Prologue, Holy Rosary). What needs do I entrust to Our Lady through the Rosary? Do I pray the Holy Rosary, if I can, with my family?
